What is the Construction Craft Laborer Apprenticeship Program?

The Construction Craft Laborer Apprenticeship Program is a collaboration between the City of Cleveland Department of Public Utilities, the Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD), and AFSCME Local 100 to provide opportunities to high school graduates who want to pursue a sewer maintenance career with Cleveland Water Pollution Control (WPC).

This program combines classroom studies and on-the-job training, allowing CMSD graduates to earn an income while getting started in a career in the wastewater industry.





What are the Minimum Qualifications for Applicants?

In order to enroll in the Water Distribution Apprenticeship Program, interested participants must meet the following requirements:

High School Graduates

- Must be between 18 and 21 years of age by program start date
- Must be a Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD) high school graduate
- Must have a satisfactory attendance rate
- Must have a letter of recommendation from a teacher, quidance counselor, or employer
- Upon program start date, a valid Ohio driver's license must be secured

GED Recipients

- Must be between 18 and 21 years of age by program start date
- Must have last attended a CMSD school prior to receiving GED
- Must have a letter of recommendation from a former teacher, guidance counselor, or employer
- Upon program start date, a valid Ohio driver's license must be secured

How do I become a Construction Craft Laborer Apprentice?

To enroll in the Construction Craft Laborer
Apprenticeship Program, interested students must
submit a completed application along with supporting
materials, including: a copy of high school transcripts
or GED diploma, a letter of recommendation, and a
copy of valid identification. An application is available at
clevelandwpc.com/apprentice

Upon successful completion of the Pre-Apprenticeship portion of the program, which includes classroom work and on-the-job experience, students will be hired into the Apprenticeship Program as full-time employees.

Successful applicants will be selected to enroll in the program based on their ability to learn and work in the apprentice occupation as determined by organizational review and assessment.
